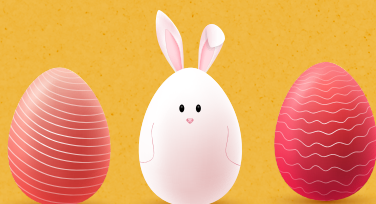
**Welcome to a delightful journey through the tradition of Orthodox Easter, translated into threads, colors, and stitches that tell stories!**

# BABY CHICK COUPLE

These little ones symbolize rebirth and the blossoming of life. In Orthodox Easter, eggs are blessed and offered as a symbol of victory over death, and chicks represent the beginning of a new journey. A perfect piece to bring cuteness and meaning to your Easter!





# COUPLE OF BABY CHICKS

Approximate size: 6.3 inches (16 cm)

## MATERIALS:

- 1 skein of Amigurumi Yarn - Colors: 1205 (Magnolia), 8001 (White), 4456 (Orange) e 1112 (Cream);
- Leftover Amigurumi Yarn – Colors: 9278 (Lhama) e 8990 (Black);
- Crochet hook – 2.5 mm;
- Stuffing;
- Tapestry needle;
- Stitch marker.

## STITCHES USED:

- Increase = inc.;
- Decrease = dec.;
- Chain = ch.;
- Double Crochet = dc.;
- Slip Stitch = sl st.;
- Single Crochet = sc.

## EXAMPLES OF HOW TO READ THIS PATTERN:

- 0th round: 0 sc.; -> Single round (follow the indicated stitches)
- 0th and 0th round: 0 sc.; -> 2 identical rounds (follow the indicated stitches)
- 0th to 0th round (0 rounds): 0 sc.; -> rounds with the same sequence
- 0th round: 0 sc., 1 inc., (00 sc., 2 inc.) 5x, 0 sc. = XX sc.; -> round with repetitions in parentheses (follow the indicated stitches and repeat what's in parentheses the specified number of times)
- 0th round: 0 sc., 1 dec. = XX sc.; -> round with repetition throughout the entire round (repeat what's between asterisks for the whole round)





## **Chick Head and Body**

### **With Amigurumi yarn 1205**

#### **(Magnolia)**

1st round: 6 sc into the magic ring;

2nd round: 6 inc. = 12 sc.;

3rd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 18 sc.;

4th round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 24 sc.;

5th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 30 sc.;

6th round: 30 sc.;

7th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 36 sc.;

8th round: 36 sc.;

9th round: \*5 sc., 1 inc.\* = 42 sc.;

10th round: 42 sc.;

11th round: \*6 sc., 1 inc.\* = 48 sc.;

12th round: \*7 sc., 1 inc.\* = 54 sc.;

13th round: \*26 sc., 1 inc.\* = 56 sc.;

14th to 19th round (6 rounds): 56 sc.;

20th round: \*5 sc., 1 dec.\* = 48 sc.;

21st round: \*4 sc., 1 dec.\* = 40 sc.;

22nd round: \*3 sc., 1 dec.\* = 32 sc.;

23rd round: \*2 sc., 1 dec.\* = 24 sc.;

24th and 25th round: 24 sc.;

26th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 30 sc.

Add stuffing to the head.

27th round: 30 sc.;

28th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 36 sc.;

29th round: 36 sc.;

30th round: \*5 sc., 1 inc.\* = 42 sc.;

31st round: \*6 sc., 1 inc.\* = 48 sc.;

32nd to 36th round (5 rounds): 48 sc.;

37th round: \*6 sc., 1 dec.\* = 42 sc.;

38th round: \*4 sc., 1 dec.\* = 35 sc.;

39th round: \*3 sc., 1 dec.\* = 28 sc.;

40th round: \*2 sc., 1 dec.\* = 21 sc.

Add stuffing to the body.

41st round: \*1 sc., 1 dec.\* = 14 sc.;

42nd round: \*2 dec., 3 sc.\* = 10 sc.

Finish with stuffing.

Close with a faux magic ring.

With Amigurumi yarn 8990 (Black),  
embroider the eyes over rounds 13  
and 14 with 7 stitches between them.

## **Chick Beak**

With Amigurumi yarn 4456 (Orange)

1st round: 4 sc into the magic ring;

2nd round: 4 inc. = 8 sc.;

3rd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 12 sc.;

4th round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 16 sc.;

5th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 20 sc.

Fasten off, leaving a yarn for sewing.

Add stuffing.

Sew between rounds 15 and 20 of the  
head.

## **Chick Feet (2)**

**With Amigurumi yarn 4456 (Orange)**

1st round (inside the magic ring): 7 ch, 1  
sl st, 8 ch, 1 sl st, 7 ch, 1 sl st, 4 ch, 1 sl st.

Fasten off, leaving a yarn for sewing.

Sew to the base of the body between  
rounds 31 and 37, with 3 stitches  
between them. The section with 4 ch is  
the bottom tip.

## **Chick Crest**

**With Amigurumi yarn 1205**

#### **(Magnolia)**

Cut 3 strands of yarn, each 4 inches  
(10 cm) long, and tie them to the top of  
the head.

Trim and fray the ends.

## **Chick Wings (2)**

**With Amigurumi yarn 1205**

#### **(Magnolia)**

1st round: 6 sc into the magic ring;

2nd round: 6 inc. = 12 sc.

For the feathers, starting from the  
next stitch, make 1 sl st and continue  
with: \*6 ch, 1 sl st\*. Repeat this  
sequence until you create 5 feathers.  
Fasten off, leaving a yarn for sewing.  
Sew to the sides of the body.



## **Chick Tail**

### **With Amigurumi yarn 1205**

#### **(Magnolia)**

Tie the yarn between rounds 36 and 37 at the center of the back. Make 5 ch, 1 sl st in the same stitch as the base of these ch, 7 ch, 1 sl st in the same stitch as the base of these ch, 9 ch, 1 sl st in the same stitch as the base of these ch, 7 ch, 1 sl st in the same stitch as the base of these ch, 5 ch, 1 sl st in the same stitch as the base of these ch.

Fasten off.

## **Eggshell (Top Part)**

### **With Amigurumi yarn 8001 (White)**

1st round: 6 sc into the magic ring;  
2nd round: 6 inc. = 12 sc;  
3rd round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 16 sc;  
4th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 20 sc;  
5th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 24 sc;  
6th round: \*5 sc., 1 inc.\* = 28 sc;  
7th round: \*6 sc., 1 inc.\* = 32 sc;  
8th round: \*7 sc., 1 inc.\* = 36 sc;  
9th round: \*8 sc., 1 inc.\* = 40 sc;  
10th round: Repeat: 1 sl st, 2 dc together in the same stitch as the sl st, skip 3 stitches until the end of the round.

Fasten off.

## **Eggshell (Bottom Part)**

### **With Amigurumi yarn 8001 (White)**

1st round: 8 sc into the magic ring;  
2nd round: 8 inc. = 16 sc;  
3rd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 24 sc;  
4th round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 32 sc;  
5th round (working in back loops only): \*7 sc, 1 inc.\* = 36 sc;  
6th round: \*5 sc., 1 inc.\* = 42 sc;  
7th round: \*6 sc., 1 inc.\* = 48 sc;  
8th round: \*11 sc., 1 inc.\* = 52 sc;

9th and 10th round: 52 sc.;

11th round: \*Repeat: 1 sl st, 2 dc

together in the same stitch as the sl st, skip 3 stitches.\*

Fasten off.

## **Head and Body of the Chick (Female)**

### **With Amigurumi yarn 1112 (Cream)**

1st round: 6 sc into the magic ring;  
2nd round: 6 inc. = 12 sc;  
3rd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 18 sc;  
4th round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 24 sc;  
5th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 30 sc.;

6th round: 30 sc.;

7th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 36 sc.;

8th round: 36 sc.;

9th round: \*5 sc., 1 inc.\* = 42 sc.;

10th round: 42 sc.;

11th round: \*6 sc., 1 inc.\* = 48 sc.;

12th round: \*7 sc., 1 inc.\* = 54 sc.;

13th round: \*26 sc, 1 inc.\* = 56 sc.;

14th to 19th round (6 rounds): 56 sc.;

20th round: \*5 sc., 1 dec.\* = 48 sc.;

21st round: \*4 sc., 1 dec.\* = 40 sc.;

22nd round: \*3 sc., 1 dec.\* = 32 sc.;

23rd round: \*2 sc., 1 dec.\* = 24 sc.;

24th and 25th round: 24 sc.;

26th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 30 sc.

Stuff the head with fiberfill.

27th round: 30 sc.;

28th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 36 sc.;

29th round: 36 sc.;

30th round: \*5 sc., 1 inc.\* = 42 sc.;

31st round: \*6 sc., 1 inc.\* = 48 sc.;

32nd to 36th round (5 rounds): 48 sc.;

37th round: \*6 sc., 1 dec.\* = 42 sc.;

38th round: \*4 sc., 1 dec.\* = 35 sc.;

39th round: \*3 sc., 1 dec.\* = 28 sc.;

40th round: \*2 sc., 1 dec.\* = 21 sc.;

Stuff the body with fiberfill.

41st round: \*1 sc., 1 dec.\* = 14 sc.;

42nd round: \*2 dec., 3 sc.\* = 10 sc.

Finish stuffing with fiberfill.



Fasten off with a fake magic ring.  
With Amigurumi yarn 8990 (Black),  
embroider the eyes on rounds 13 and  
14, leaving 7 stitches between them.

### **Beak of the Chick (Female)**

#### **With Amigurumi yarn 4456 (Orange)**

1st round: 4 sc. into the magic ring;  
2nd round: 4 inc. = 8 sc.;  
3rd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 12 sc.;  
4th round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 16 sc.;  
5th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 20 sc.;  
Fasten off, leaving a yarn for sewing.  
Stuff with fiberfill.  
Sew between rounds 15 and 20 of the  
head.

### **Feet of the Chick (Female) (2)**

#### **With Amigurumi yarn 4456 (Orange)**

1st round (inside the magic ring): 7 ch, 1  
sl st, 8 ch, 1 sl st, 7 ch, 1 sl st, 4 ch, 1 sl st.  
Fasten off, leaving a yarn for sewing.  
Sew to the base of the body between  
rounds 31 and 37, with 3 stitches  
between them. The part with 4 ch is  
the bottom tip.

### **Crest of the Chick (Female)**

#### **With Amigurumi yarn 1112 (Cream)**

Cut 3 pieces of yarn, each 4 inches (10  
cm) long, and tie them at the top of the  
head.  
Trim and fray the ends.

### **Wings of the Chick (Female) (2)**

#### **With Amigurumi yarn 1205 (Magnolia)**

1st round: 6 sc. into the magic ring;  
2nd round: 6 inc. = 12 sc.  
For the feathers, from the next stitch,  
make 1 sl st, and then continue with: \*6  
ch, 1 sl st\*. Repeat this sequence until  
you form 5 feathers.

Fasten off, leaving a yarn for sewing.  
Sew to the sides of the body.

### **Tail of the Chick (Female)**

#### **With Amigurumi yarn 1112 (Cream)**

Tie the yarn between rounds 36 and  
37 at the center of the back. Make 5  
ch, 1 sl st in the same stitch as the  
base of the ch, 7 ch, 1 sl st in the same  
stitch as the base of the ch, 9 ch, 1 sl st  
in the same stitch as the base of the  
ch, 7 ch, 1 sl st in the same stitch as the  
base of the ch, 5 ch, 1 sl st in the same  
stitch as the base of the ch.  
Fasten off.

### **Tie**

#### **With Amigurumi yarn 9278 (Llama)**

Work in rows back and forth.  
Make 5 ch., skip 1 ch.  
1st to 23rd round (23 rows): 4 sc  
(TURN);  
24th round: 4 sc.  
Join the starting round with the final  
one, forming a ring. Wrap a piece of  
yarn around the middle and tie it to  
the crest.

# EASTER BUNNY

Although the bunny is a stronger symbol in the West, its presence can also represent fertility and abundance in Orthodox Easter. This amigurumi will bring the sweetness and charm that make this season even more special!





# EASTER BUNNY

**Approximate size:** 9 inches (23 cm)

## MATERIALS:

- 1 skein of Amigurumi yarn - Colors: 7066 (Stone) and 7072 (Rye);
- Leftover Amigurumi yarn – Colors: 4093 (Organza) and 8990 (Black);
- Safety eyes (10 mm) – Black;
- Crochet hook - 2.5 mm;
- Stuffing;
- Tapestry needle;
- Stitch marker.

## STITCHES USED:

- Increase = inc.;
- Decrease = dec.;
- Chain = ch.;
- Half Double Crochet = hdc.;
- Double Crochet = dc.;
- Slip Stitch = sl st.;
- Single Crochet = sc.

## EXAMPLES OF HOW TO READ THIS PATTERN:

- 0th round: 0 sc.; -> Single round (follow the indicated stitches)
- 0th and 0th round: 0 sc.; -> 2 identical rounds (follow the indicated stitches)
- 0th to 0th round (0 rounds): 0 sc.; -> rounds with the same sequence
- 0th round: 0 sc., 1 inc., (00 sc., 2 inc.) 5x, 0 sc. = XX sc.; -> round with repetitions in parentheses (follow the indicated stitches and repeat what's in parentheses the specified number of times)
- 0th round: 0 sc., 1 dec. = XX sc.; -> round with repetition throughout the entire round (repeat what's between asterisks for the whole round)





## Head

### With the Amigurumi yarn 7066 (Stone)

1st round: 6 sc. into the magic ring;

2nd round: 6 inc. = 12 sc.;

3rd round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 16 sc.;

4th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 20 sc.;

5th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 24 sc.;

6th round: \*5 sc., 1 inc.\* = 28 sc.;

7th round: \*6 sc., 1 inc.\* = 32 sc.;

8th round: \*7 sc., 1 inc.\* = 36 sc.;

9th round: \*8 sc., 1 inc.\* = 40 sc.;

10th round: \*9 sc., 1 inc.\* = 44 sc.;

11th round: \*10 sc., 1 inc.\* = 48 sc.;

12th to 23rd round (12 rounds): 48 sc.

Place the safety eyes between rounds 11 and 12, with 14 stitches of distance between them.

24th round: \*6 sc., 1 dec.\* = 42 sc.;

25th round: \*5 sc., 1 dec.\* = 36 sc.;

26th round: \*4 sc., 1 dec.\* = 30 sc.;

27th round: \*3 sc., 1 dec.\* = 24 sc.;

28th round: \*2 sc., 1 dec.\* = 18 sc.

Add stuffing.

29th round: \*1 sc., 1 dec.\* = 12 sc.;

30th round: \*2 sc., 1 dec.\* = 8 sc.

Fasten off with a false magic ring.

With the same yarn as the head, sink the eyes.

Embroider the nose with Amigurumi yarn 8990 (Black), and the cheeks with Amigurumi yarn 4093 (Organza).

For the light version, make the head with **Amigurumi yarn 7072 (Rye)**.

## Body

### With Amigurumi yarn 7066 (Stone)

1st round: 8 sc. into the magic ring;

2nd round: 8 inc. = 16 sc.;

3rd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 24 sc.;

4th round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 32 sc.;

5th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 40 sc.;

6th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 48 sc.;

7th round: 48 sc., working only into the back loop;

8th round: \*7 sc., 1 inc.\* = 54 sc.;

9th round: \*8 sc., 1 inc.\* = 60 sc.;

10th round: 21 sc., (1 inc., 3 sc.) 5x,

19 sc. = 65 sc.;

11th round: 24 sc., (1 inc., 4 sc.) 4x,

21 sc. = 69 sc.;

12th to 20th round (9 rounds): 69 sc.;

21st round: 27 sc., (1 dec., 4 sc.) 4x,

18 sc. = 65 sc.;

22nd round: 24 sc., (1 dec., 3 sc.) 5x,

16 sc. = 60 sc.;

23rd round: 60 sc.;

24th round: 21 sc., (1 dec., 4 sc.) 4x, 15 sc. = 56 sc.;

25th round: \*12 sc., 1 dec.\* = 52 sc.;

26th round: 15 sc., (1 dec., 3 sc.) 5x,

12 sc. = 47 sc.;

27th round: 16 sc., (1 dec., 3 sc.) 4x,

11 sc. = 43 sc.;

28th round: 17 sc., (1 dec., 3 sc.) 3x,

11 sc. = 40 sc.;

29th round: \*6 sc., 1 dec.\* = 35 sc.;

30th round: \*5 sc., 1 dec.\* = 30 sc.;

31st round: \*4 sc., 1 dec.\* = 25 sc.;

32nd round: 6 sc., 1 hdc, 13 dc, 1 hdc, 4 sc. = 25 stitches;

33rd round: 25 sl st.

Add stuffing.

Fasten off, leaving a yarn for sewing.

Sew the neck between rows 11 and 21 of the head.

For the light version, make the body with **Amigurumi yarn 7072 (Rye)**.

## Ears (2)

### With Amigurumi yarn 7066 (Stone)

1st round: 4 sc. into the magic ring;

2nd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 6 sc.;

3rd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 9 sc.;



4th round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 12 sc.;  
5th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 15 sc.;  
6th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 18 sc.;  
7th round: \*5 sc., 1 inc.\* = 21 sc.;  
8th round: \*6 sc., 1 inc.\* = 24 sc.;  
9th to 12th round (4 rounds): 24 sc.;  
13th round: \*6 sc., 1 dec.\* = 21 sc.;  
14th round: 21 sc.;  
15th round: \*5 sc., 1 dec.\* = 18 sc.;  
16th round: \*4 sc., 1 dec.\* = 15 sc.;  
17th to 20th round (4 rounds): 15 sc.  
It is not necessary to add stuffing.  
Fasten off, leaving a yarn for sewing.  
Fold in half and sew onto the head,  
between rounds 19 and 22, separated  
by 2 stitches.  
For the light version, make both ears  
with **Amigurumi yarn 7072 (Rye)**.

## Tail

**With Amigurumi yarn 7066 (Stone)**

1st round: 6 sc. into the magic ring;  
2nd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 9 sc.;  
3rd round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 12 sc.;  
4th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 15 sc.;  
5th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 18 sc.;  
6th to 10th round (5 rounds): 18 sc.;  
11th round: \*4 sc., 1 dec.\* = 15 sc.;  
12th round: \*3 sc., 1 dec.\* = 12 sc.;  
13th round: \*2 sc., 1 dec.\* = 9 sc.  
It is not necessary to add stuffing.  
Fold and close the sides with 4 sc.  
Fasten off, leaving a yarn for sewing.  
Sew onto row 11 of the body.  
For the light version, make both ears  
with **Amigurumi yarn 7072 (Rye)**.

## Tie

**With Amigurumi yarn 4093 (Organza)**

Make a chain of approximately 110 ch  
(16.5 inches/42 cm).  
Fasten off.  
Tie it around the neck.

For the light version, make the bow  
with Amigurumi yarn 7066 (Stone).

# EASTER EGGS

Decorated eggs are one of the most important symbols of Orthodox Easter. Traditionally painted red to represent the blood of Christ and the resurrection, they are now seen in a variety of colors and patterns. We'll teach you how to create amigurumis inspired by these meaningful eggs!





# EASTER EGGS

## Approximate size:

Basket 5.9 inches (15 cm) in diameter and egg 2.8 inches (7 cm) in height.

## MATERIALS:

- 1 skein of Amigurumi yarn – Colors: 7625 (Chestnut), 3528 (Carmine), 1289 (Canary), 5076 (Hera), 2500 (Acqua), 4445 (Tangerine), 6614 (Alfazema) e 8001 (White);
- Crochet hook – 2,5 mm;
- Stuffing;
- Tapestry needle;
- Stitch marker.

## STITCHES USED:

- Increase = inc.;
- Decrease = dec.;
- Chain = ch.;
- Slip Stitch = sl st.;
- Extended Single Crochet = esc.;
- Single Crochet = sc.

## EXAMPLES OF HOW TO READ THIS PATTERN:

- 0th round: 0 sc.; -> Single round (follow the indicated stitches)
- 0th and 0th round: 0 sc.; -> 2 identical rounds (follow the indicated stitches)
- 0th to 0th round (0 rounds): 0 sc.; -> rounds with the same sequence
- 0th round: 0 sc., 1 inc., (00 sc., 2 inc.) 5x, 0 sc. = XX sc.; -> round with repetitions in parentheses (follow the indicated stitches and repeat what's in parentheses the specified number of times)
- 0th round: 0 sc., 1 dec. = XX sc.; -> round with repetition throughout the entire round (repeat what's between asterisks for the whole round)





## **Basket**

### **With the Amigurumi yarn 7625 (Chestnut)**

1st round: 7 sc. into the magic ring;

2nd round: 7 inc. = 14 sc.;

3rd round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 21 sc.;

4th round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 28 sc.;

5th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 35 sc.;

6th round: \*4 sc., 1 inc.\* = 42 sc.;

7th round: \*5 sc., 1 inc.\* = 49 sc.;

8th round: \*6 sc., 1 inc.\* = 56 sc.;

9th round: \*7 sc., 1 inc.\* = 63 sc.;

10th round: \*8 sc., 1 inc.\* = 70 sc.;

11th round: \*9 sc., 1 inc.\* = 77 sc.;

12th round: \*10 sc., 1 inc.\* = 84 sc.;

13th round: \*11 sc., 1 inc.\* = 91 sc.;

14th round: 91 sc, working in back loops only;

15th round: \*1 sc., 1 extended sc.\*;

16th round: \*1 extended sc., 1 sc.\*;

17th round: \*1 sc., 1 extended sc.\*;

18th round: \*1 extended sc., 1 sc.\*;

19th round: \*1 sc., 1 extended sc.\*.

In the next round, make the handles:

20th round: 25 sc, 12 ch, skip 9 stitches

from the base, 36 sc, 12 ch, skip 9

stitches from the base, 12 sc = 97

stitches;

21st round: 25 sl st, 18 sc in the

handle's chains, 36 sl st, 18 sc in the

other handle's chains, 12 sl st.

Fasten off.

## **Red Egg:**

### **With the Amigurumi yarn 3528 (Carmine)**

1st round: 6 sc. into the magic ring;

2nd round: 6 inc. = 12 sc.;

3rd round: 12 sc.;

4th round: \*1 sc., 1 inc.\* = 18 sc.;

5th round: 18 sc.;

6th round: \*2 sc., 1 inc.\* = 24 sc.;

7th round: 24 sc.;

8th round: \*3 sc., 1 inc.\* = 30 sc.;
