Size: 6 Level of difficulty: Intermediate

Material

Circulo Charme 4 balls color #3201 cameo Circulo Encanto 4 balls color #3201 cameo Crochet hook E-4/3.5 mm or size to obtain gauge Tapestry needle, scissors and measuring tape.

Stitch glossary and abbreviations:

stitch: st make: mk skip: sk chain: ch slip st: sl st single crochet: sc double crochet: dc 5 dc cluster: 5 dc closed tog in the same base st Crab st: sc from left to right Increase: inc decrease: dec round: rnd end of row/rnd: eor. Pattern A - part 1 and 2 - follow chart 1 Pattern B - follow chart 2 Cuffs - follow chart 3

Gauge: $17 \text{ S x } 9 \text{ R} = 4^{"}/10 \text{ cm}$ over Pattern A (chart 1 - part 1) using hook E-4/3.5 mm.

Top: use Charme color #3201 cameo. Crochet in the round. front and back are worked simultaneously. Close rnds with 1 sl st. Start at waistline. Ch 168, close ring. R1 - 32: follow Pattern A - part 1- chart 1 = 28 motifs. Flatten piece and divide into front and back and work sides separately. Crochet

back and forth.

Back continuation (83 sts): R33 - 49: Follow Pattern A - part 2 - chart 2. Fasten off.

Front continuation (83 sts): R33 - 45: Follow Pattern A - part 2 - chart 2. Fasten off.

Neckline shaping: do not work on the central 33 sts and work sides separately: 25 sts on each side. Dec 1 st on the neckline side every 2 rows (2x). Fasten off with a tail for sewing (approx. 12"). Use this tail and tapestry needle to join shoulders (4.75"), leave 6.75" open for arms.

Sleeves (make 2): use Charme color #3201 cameo. Join yarn at armhole. Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st. R1 - 35: follow pattern B - chart 2 and rep sts = 11 motifs.

Cuff


R36 - 39: follow chart 3 = 44 sts in each rnd. Fasten off. Make other sleeve.


Finishings: use Charme color #3201 cameo. Join yarn at neckline. Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st. R1 & 2: 90 sc in each rnd.

R3: Crab st. Fasten off and weave in ends. Join yarn at bottom and make one rnd in Crab st = 168 sts. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Crochet fringe tassel (make 97 fringes for each sleeves): Use Encanto color #3201 cameo


Cut 20 strands to 10", insert needle in place, fold yarn in half, pull yarn into loop, pull edges and release (1 tassel) repeat as many times it is required around sleeves. See blue dotted lines on the measurement chart with the number of fringes per tier.

L'amour Dress

Size: 6 Level of difficulty: Advanced

Material - Circulo Yarns

Anne - 8 balls color #3528 carmine Crochet hook 2 mm or size to obtain gauge. Scissors, measuring tape and tapestry needle 1 button approx. 0.40" dia Sewing thread and needle 1 14.5" zipper in the same color of dress Fabric to line dress

Stitch glossary and abbreviations:

stitch: st make: mk skip: sk chain: ch slip st: sl st single crochet: sc half double crochet: hdc double crochet: dc 2 dc cluster: 2 dc closed tog in the same base st. dc3tog: 3 dc closed tog in different base sts. picot: ch 3, 1 sl st into ch 1. Increase: inc decrease: dec round: rnd end of row/rnd: eor.

Rosette A - follow chart 1 Rosette B - follow chart 2 Rosette C - follow chart 3 Rosette D - follow chart 4 Rosette E - follow chart 5 Motif to join rosettes - follow chart 6 Half-rosette - follow chart 7 Rosette F - follow chart 8

Gauge: Rosette C - chart 3 = 4.5" x 4.5" using hook 2 mm.

Pattern notes

Use hook 2 mm and Anne to make all Rosettes and motifs according to amount mentioned for each one.

Rosette A - make 4 (7.5" x 7.5"): Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st. Make a magic ring. R1: ch 3, 15 dc. R2 - 9: follow chart 1.

Rosette B - make 58 (6.75" x 6.75"): Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st. Make a magic ring. R1: ch 3, 15 dc. R2 - 8: follow chart 2. Rosette C - make 17 (4.5" x 4.5"): Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st.

Make a magic ring.

R1: ch 3 + 1 dc closed tog, *ch 2, 2 dc cluster* rep from * to * 6 more times, ch 2, 1 sl st.

R2 - 4: follow chart 3.

Rosette D - make 6 (6.25" x 6.25"): Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st. Make a magic ring. R1: ch 3, 15 dc. R2 - 7: follow chart 4.

Rosette E - make 6 (3.25" x 3.25"): Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st.

Make a magic ring.

R1: ch 3 + 1 dc closed tog, *ch 2, 2 dc cluster* rep from * to * 6 more times, ch 2, 1 sl st.
R2 - 3: follow chart 5.

Motif to join rosettes Chart 6 make 141 (1.25" x 1.25")

Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st.

Make a magic ring.

R1: ch 1, *1 sc, ch 4, 1 sc, ch 4* rep from * to * 2 more times, 1 sc, 1sl st.

Half-rosette - make 2 (2" x 3.5"): Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st. Make a magic ring.

R1: ch 5, *2 dc cluster, ch 2* rep from * to * 3 more times, 1 dc.

R2 - 4: crochet back and forth, follow chart 7.


Rosette F - make 8 (2" x 2"): Crochet in the round. Close rnds with 1 sl st. Make a magic ring. R1: ch 3 + 1 dc closed tog, *ch 2, 2 dc


cluster* rep from * to * 6 more times, ch 2, 1 sl st. R3: follow chart 8.


Dress assembly: After you completed all the motifs follow assembly chart and join motifs with 1 sl st. Leave 6.75" open on each side for armholes and 14.5" open on back to sew zipper.

Back opening finishing: Work around the back opening in sc. Switch to sewing thread and needle and sew zipper onto back and sew button onto neckline right side.

Lining: Use crochet dress as a template to make slip. Sew onto shoulders, neckline and back opening.







NOTRE DAME





Notre Dame dress

Size: 6 Level of difficulty: Advanced

Material - Circulo Yarns Circulo Yarns Anne - 6 balls color #2151 sky Crochet hook 2.5 mm or size to obtain gauge. Scissors, measuring tape and tapestry needle 3 rhinestone buttons approx. 0.20" dia 10 yds of blue elastic cord Sewing thread and needle 1 17.75" zipper in the same color of dress Fabric to line dress

Stitch glossary and abbreviations:

st make: mk skip: sk chain: ch slip st: sl st single crochet: sc half double crochet: hdc double crochet: dc treble crochet: tr dc2tog: 2 dc closed tog in different base sts. 3 dc cluster: 3 dc closed tog in the same base st. dc3tog: 3 dc closed tog in different base sts. front post double crochet: FPdc back post double crochet: BPdc picot: ch 3, 1 sl st into ch 1. Increase: inc decrease: dec round: rnd end of row/rnd: eor. Pattern A - follow chart 1 Pattern B - follow chart 2

Pattern C - follow chart 3 Top front end- follow chart 4 Top back end - follow chart 5 Pattern D - follow chart 6 Crochet edge - follow chart 7 Sleeve end - follow chart 8 Collar - follow chart 9

Gauge: 21 S x 10 R = 4"/10 cm over Pattern A - chart 1 using hook 2.5 mm.

Top: Front and back are worked simultaneously. Crochet back and forth. Start at waistline. Start at left back. Ch 160. R1 - 8: Follow pattern A - chart 1 and rep sts = 40 motifs. Then follow chart 2 & 3. Sides: front sides and half of right and left back: follow chart 2 - Pattern B = 7 motifs for each side. Central front panel: R1 - 17: Follow chart 3 - Pattern C. Now work front and both backs separately. Front continuation R18 - 29: follow chart 4 Back continuation R18 - 29: follow chart 5 Skirt: Join Anne into foundation chain. Crochet back and forth. R1 - 8: follow chart 2 and rep sts - Pattern B = 19 motifs.

Crochet in the round.

Follow chart 6 and rep sts - Pattern D and the amount of motifs per tier: Tier 1 - R1 - 8: 19 motifs

Tier 2 - R9 - 16: 20 motifs

Tier 3 - R17 - 24: 32 motifs Tier 4 - R25 - 32: 32 motifs Tier 5 - R33 - 40: 32 motifs Tier 6 - R41 - 48: 32 motifs Tier 7 - R49 - 56: 47 motifs Tier 8 - R57 - 64: 47 motifs Tier 9 - R65 - 67: 47 motifs End with crochet edge - follow chart 7 and rep sts = 135 motifs. Fasten off.

Ruffle - skirt

Note: only the first rnd is worked on the dress. Join Anne into R16 of Tier 2

R1 - 8: follow chart 6 and rep sts - Pattern D = 46 motifs. Fasten off.

R38 of tier 5: make one rnd in sc. Fasten off and set piece aside.

Sleeves (make 2): Crochet back and forth. Ch 120. R1 - 20: Follow chart 2 and rep sts - Pattern B = 10 motifs R21 - 34: follow chart 8 - Sleeve end. Make the other sleeve and set them aside.

Assembly and finishing: Use tapestry needle and Anne to close sleeves (8") and join sleeves onto body (5.5").

Insert 2 rounds of elastic into row 2 on the WS, pull gently.

Collar: Join Anne at neckline in the left back.

Crochet back and forth.

R1 - 11: follow chart 9 and rep sts = 82 sts.

Lining: Use crochet dress as a template to make a sleeveless slip. Sew onto shoulders, neckline and back opening with zipper. Sew the 3 buttons onto the left side of collar.
